Dr. Rossow completed his PhD in cardiology on channel physiology at the University of Nevada and subsequently completed a post-doctoral fellowship investigation regulation of voltage gated potassium channel's and cardiac arrhythmia at the University of Washington. Dr. Rossow continued at the University of Washington completing medical school, Internal Medicine Residency and Cardiology Fellowship training in Seattle.

He completed Interventional Cardiology Fellowship at the University of Utah. During his tenure at the University of Washington, he was active in both clinical medicine and research. He has published in multiple peer review journal's including: Circulation, Circulation Research, Journal of General Physiology, Current Cardiology Reports, Annals of the American Thoracic Society, Acta Physiological, Journal of Molecular and Cellular Cardiology, Journal of Physiology, Journal of Biological Chemistry, Journal of Clinical Investigation and American Journal of Physiology: Heart. In 2006, he was awarded the Young Investigator Award from the North American Section of the International Society of Heart Research. He has also been recognized for teaching awards and patient care awards.

Dr. Rossow is a native of the South Puget Sound area with strong ties to the area. In 2019, he accepted his current position with Providence Cardiology Associates, a move that brought him closer to home. He maintains board certifications in Internal Medicine, Cardiology and Intervention Cardiology. He is passionate about providing the highest level of patient care to our community. He has a love for the outdoors.

I am new member in Mended Hearts. It surprised me that I would become a member. As an active person who walked every day& stayed busy, I never expected that I would need help with a medical condition. I noticed walking & mowing my yard became harder and harder to do. I figured it was just age creeping up on me. Then came the day where I woke & found it hard to breathe.

I had some tests done, which came back & showed I needed surgery. I was stuck with so many questions & I could not get straight answers from the doctors.

My father in law who lived with my wife & I for many years (to age 97) was a member of Mended Hearts, and my wife suggested that we contact the local Mended Hearts chapter. The pandemic made it difficult for people to access the hospital. The hospital agreed I could see someone. Luck was with me because Diane Caputo was at St. Peter's hospital and came to talk with my wife & me.

Diane patiently answered every question that I asked her and provided information about bypass surgery that I did not know. Diane told me honestly what to expect through the process. Diane handed me the book she had written about her experience with the surgery. "From One Mended Heart to Another "The Cardiac Patient's Companion."

If you have not read the book, you should. (It is available on Amazon). I read it cover to cover while I waited for my surgery and finally understood what was expected.

On May 5th 2022. (Cinco De Mayo) I had open heart surgery.

When I was taken to the operating room I was calmer & ready because I had a better idea of what to expect. I was aware of the steps that would happen in recovery & was ready to face them. In Diane's book, she talks about a fifty day recovery period. This was the amount of time when she got close to feeling normal again, & she was spot on.

The comfort that I took to the operating room was something Diane added near the end of her book. I shared it with the Doctors & prep nurses in pre-op & they dashed to their cell phones to look it up. Psalm 73:26. It can be found on your cell phone also.

I am now on the road to better health feeling much stronger thanks to my wife Mariann, & all the love & support she has given me. I have Diane to thank for a bit of confidence when I needed it.

Meeting her again at the picnic was special & I told her so. Alive and healing is a special gift & I am glad I got to share that with her.
